At 6:30am this past Valentine's Day, sixteen members of the senior high ski club boarded a bus to Seven Springs Mountain Resort to volunteer at the Special Olympics Winter Games. These students were individually paired with competitors and were asked to take care of athlete's needs throughout the day's events. Our volunteers helped warm the athletes up by taking practice runs on the slopes, escorted them to their timed events, and cheered them on as they competed.

This was the 26th year Freeport's ski club members have been at the Special Olympics Winter Games in Pennsylvania and our volunteers helped make sure that the nearly 300 athletes who showed up to compete were afforded their opportunity to shine. These Olympic-type sports give these athletes continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, and experience joy.

Volunteering with the Special Olympics pushes many of our students outside of their comfort zone as they get paired to work with youth and adults with intellectual disabilities. For many of students, this opportunity places them in the role of caregiver for the first time and develops their ability to take responsibility for others. Our students walk away from this experience with a new appreciation for their capacity to impact the larger community and you can see from the smiling faces



of the students that it was a lot of fun to boot!

Science teachers will also be conducting "severe weather" lessons in their classes prior to the drill so students have a better understanding of severe weather.

# **PMEA District 3 Honors Band**


