

Digital Editing

How it works.

In Digital Editing, you are the producer along with your peers. You will work on a variety of production assignments including music videos, short film assignments and special features. You will work on two major programs: Home Made Videos and The Buzz. These programs will air on our school district channel on Wednesday evenings at 8:00 P.M.

Due to the nature of television production work, students will be expected to work in groups of two to four. Students are free to work with whomever they choose for each program. Students may change production partners after the completion of a project.

This class requires independent out-of-school filming. Students are responsible for the equipment they take from school. Never leave equipment in a car over night.

Keep your "A."

All of your work must be perfectly constructed for air; therefore, you and your group members will work to make your segment free of all flaws. **Your grade is based on your ability to meet deadlines.** Your group will have three deadlines to meet for each assignment. For example with The Buzz, your group will have a transcription deadline (50 pts.), a script deadline (50 pts.) and an editing deadline (100 pts.). Minimum deadline periods will be as follows: transcription deadline 14 school days, script deadline 5 school days, and editing deadline 10 school days. Due to unforeseen technical problems, deadline periods may be longer, particularly for the first show.

No Excuses.

Your production group will know of each deadline the very same day you receive the assignment; therefore, absences are not an excuse for not having met a deadline (especially since this is group work). Meeting deadlines is the very nature of Journalism. No one wants to read about the results of Super Bowl Sunday on the following Friday. Timing is everything. Each day passed the deadline equals the loss of 5 points including weekends or holidays. Meeting your deadlines is imperative in order to receive an "A."

Editing. In addition to class time, students must make time to edit before, during or after school. It is the only way to meet your deadline.

Other Productions. In addition to The Buzz, there may be other programs that we will produce. The same principle applies, MEET YOUR DEADLINES.

One Evening Production.

During one of your four nine-week periods, you must participate in one evening production. Since many students participate in sports and other activities, make sure you schedule your production work during the off-season. Don't wait until the night of Graduation and say you have to work. These productions include plays, musicals, concerts, sporting events, Bee-TV Specials and more. This assignment will be worth 30 points, which will be added to the grading period in which the production occurs.
