# MAP: Measures of Academic Progress

- ⇒ MAP Tests are given three times each year to students in grades K-5.
- ⇒ Kindergarten and First
  Grade students take Reading
  and Math tests each time.
  Second through Fifth Grade
  students take Reading,
  Math, and Language tests
  each assessment period.
- ⇒ MAP Tests determine your child's instructional level and measure academic growth throughout the school year and from year to year.
- ⇒ Results will be discussed and parent/teacher conferences and/or sent home in your child's report card.

# RtII—Response to Instruction and Intervention

#### What is RtII?

RtII stands for "Response to Instruction and Intervention":

An <u>intervention</u> is a program or a service provided by the school to help a student in need of additional instruction. Each student involved will have a <u>response</u> to the intervention provided.

In short, RtII is a program that provides students with instruction targeted to meet their academic needs. Interventions are most often delivered in small groups during grade level "Flex Time".

#### RtII and Interventions

Students who are in need of additional help are provided with researched-based interventions. These interventions are provided by our school staff, which includes classroom teachers, the Reading Specialist, and the RtII coordinator.

### **RtII and Students**

- \* All students are in RtII Tier 1. This tier is our school curriculum.
- Students are moved into RtII Tier 2 by the core team if their assessment data identifies them as a student in need of additional instruction. The instruction could be remediation for struggling students or enrichment for advanced learners. Interventions begin as soon as a student is identified.
- Struggling students who meet their Tier 2 goals can be moved back into Tier 1 when progress is shown based on Dibels, MAP testing, and teacher observation.
- Struggling students who do not make progress in Tier 2 are moved into Tier 3. These students may be provided instruction through a replacement curriculum and may be considered for academic testing by school personnel.



## **Rtll FAQs**

- Are all students in RtII? YES, every student in the school is in RtII Tier 1. Tier 1 is the core school curriculum. Some of these students will become RtII Tier 2 or Tier 3 students. These are the students who show a need for additional instruction or enrichment according to school data.
- Does this mean that my child is failing? No, it means that your child is having academic difficulties in school, or needs more challenging opportunities, and the school is providing assistance.
- Will my child remain in Tier 2/3 for the entire school year? Not necessarily, your child will be moved back into Tier 1 if his/her intervention goals are met.
- When does this take place? Tiered placement is determined when a team of staff members meet to discuss data and classroom performance 3x/year. Flex Time takes place three times each week.
