Course Description

Web Design will introduce you to the world of designing and creating materials that integrate of multiple forms of media. Learn how to present ideas by using text, graphics, pictures, sounds and motion using presentation software. Explore issues related to the design, development, and implementation of multimedia projects. Upon completion to the course a student would understand how to develop a web page to take a multimedia approach to capture an audience and deliver a message. This will involve posting a web site to the internet for a class project.

Course Objectives

1. Understand simple HTML code.
2. Critique websites according to good design and usability criteria
3. Create web page layouts with CSS.
4. Use Dreamweaver software to create a working web site with text, pictures and graphics to meet particular specifications.

Homework Policy

All homework and class assignments must be completed and turned in on the due date. Points will be deducted if assignments are turned in late.

Notebook Policy

Students are expected to take notes during class and to keep those notes organized in their folder. Notebooks may be checked from time to time and assigned a grade.

Testing

Quizzes may or may not be announced.

Tests will be announced a few days in advance. If a student is aware of a test date but is absent...

- the day **of** the test, he/she must take the test on the day of return.
- the day **before** the test, the student must take the test with the rest of the class.

Class Discussions & Current Events

- Students will be expected to read current events and a class novel
- Students will be expected to participate in class discussions related to relevant reading

Grading

Students will be graded on the following items

1. Classroom participation (activities, projects, group work, discussions, prepared for class and acceptable behavior)
2. In class assignments and projects. (Heavy grading emphasis is on project completion according to required specifications) Projects must be completed & turned in on time to receive full credit.
3. Quizzes (may or may not be announced)
4. Tests (always announced a few days prior)

Grading will be on the point basis. At the end of the nine weeks, the possible number of points will be totaled. Your total points will be divided by the total possible points and a percent will be calculated. Grades are based on the school district grading scale.

NOTE: Assignment points may be deducted if a student is using the computer in a manner that is against classroom rules.
