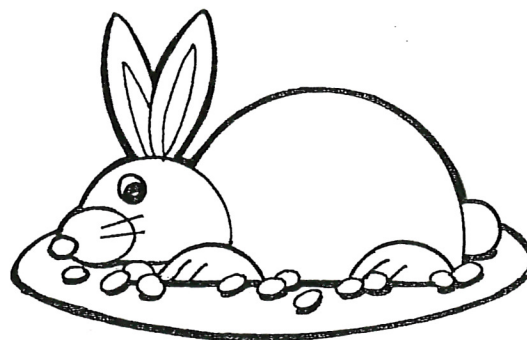


Easter Traditions

Clues:

3. The countries located on the European mainland do not refer to the holiday as “Easter.”
4. In the country known for its great Notre Dame Cathedral, mothers tell their children that Easter chimes bring eggs. Legend has it that the bells fly to Rome until Easter and drop eggs on the way back for boys and girls to find.
5. The Spanish watch bullfights and dance to lively music in their Pascua celebration.

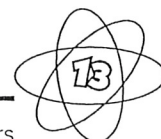

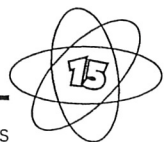


A CLASS PARTY

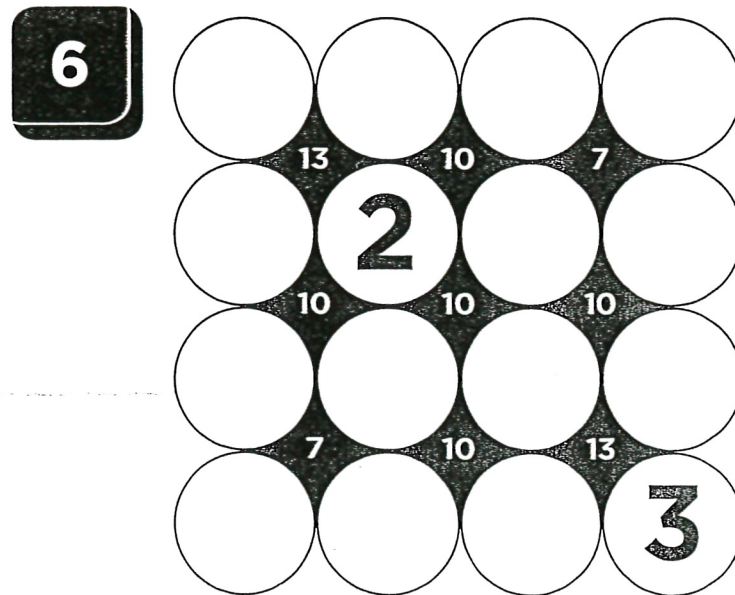
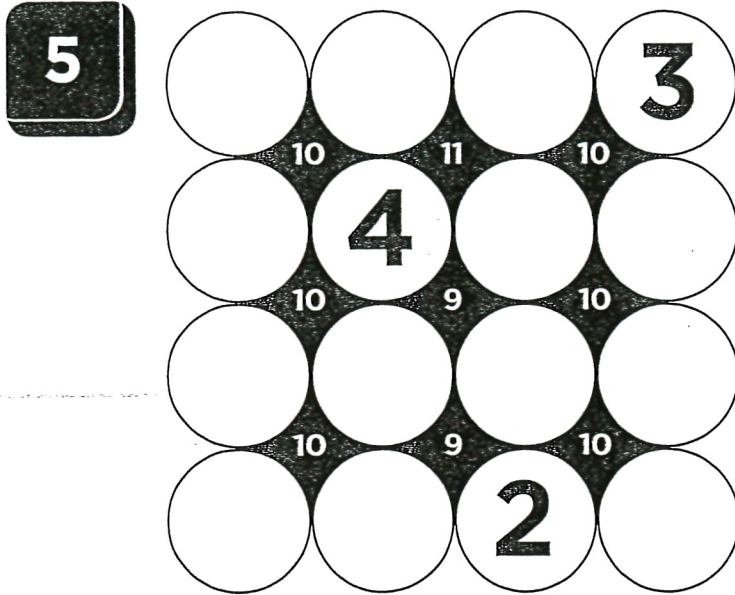

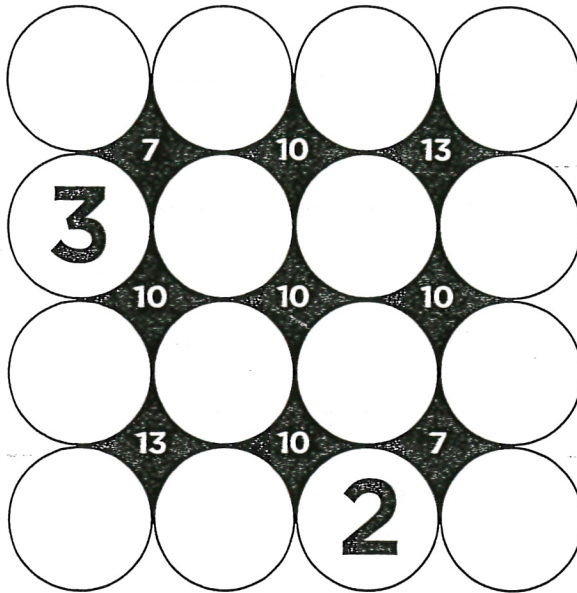

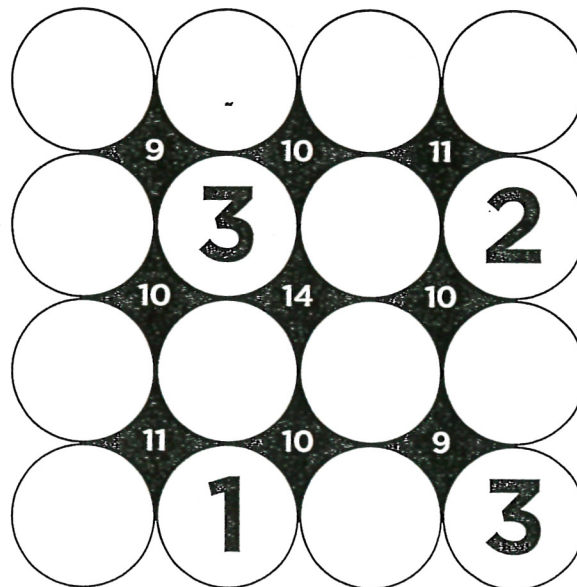
